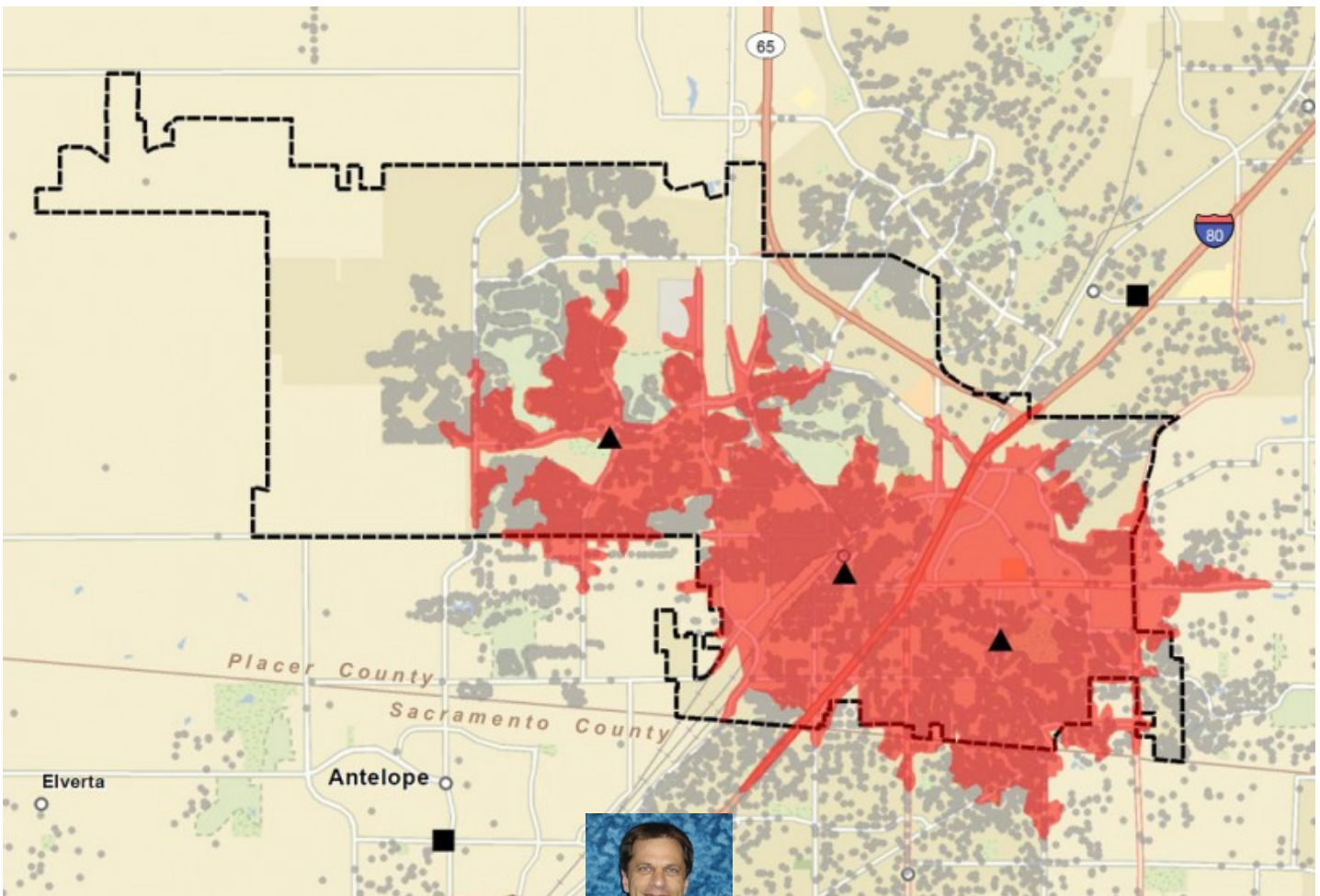

“No, like Geographic Information System.”

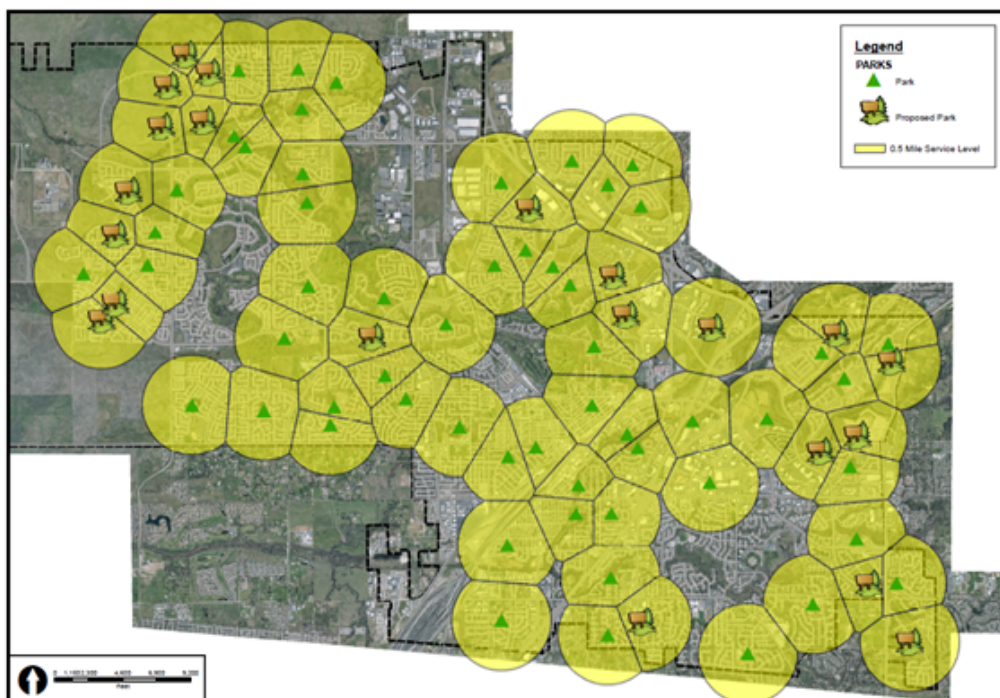
“Huh.”

“I make maps.”

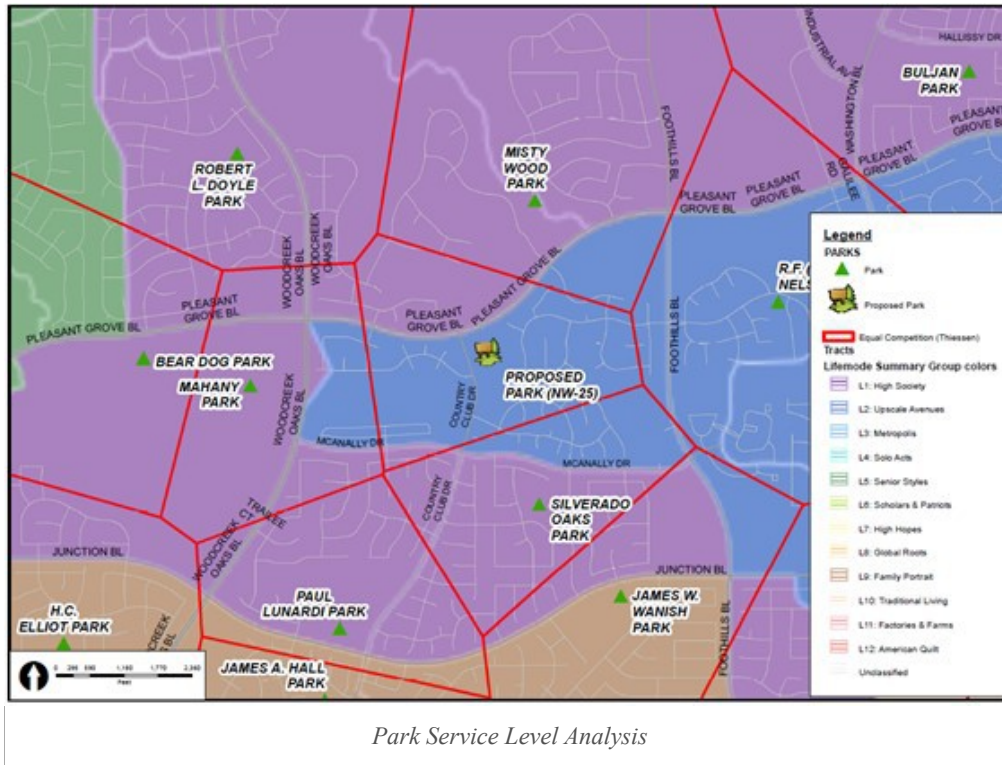
“Ohhh.”
